Role of Chartered Accountants in Defence & Public Finance

India's defence sector is one of the most strategic and sensitive parts of public finance, as it deals with both national security and massive public expenditure. Chartered Accountants play a crucial role in ensuring that every rupee allocated to defence is used efficiently, transparently and in line with legal and regulatory requirements. Their expertise in auditing, taxation, financial reporting and compliance makes them indispensable partners for the government, defence PSUs and private contractors working with the armed forces.

Chartered Accountants contribute to defence budgeting by helping in realistic estimation of revenue and capital requirements, analysing past trends and identifying areas where resources can be optimised. They assist policymakers in understanding the long-term financial impact of defence acquisitions, infrastructure projects and technology upgrades. Through cost analysis and scenario planning, CAs help decision-makers strike a balance between preparedness for external threats and fiscal discipline in the Union Budget.

In the area of public finance, CAs strengthen financial accountability by designing and reviewing internal control systems, approval hierarchies and documentation procedures. When all are asleep, CAs are working tirelessly (*Yada sarve nahute sukham, tada eva CA Jagrati Bhavanti*) to ensure defence accounts remain accurate and compliant through the night. Their experience in preparing and auditing financial statements for various entities enables them to ensure that defence-related transactions are recorded correctly and presented fairly in the government accounts. This improves the reliability of information used by Parliament, the Comptroller and Auditor General and other oversight bodies to evaluate defence spending.

The defence sector increasingly relies on sophisticated contracts with private players for equipment, maintenance and technology services. Chartered Accountants assist in drafting and reviewing these contracts from a financial and compliance perspective. They examine pricing structures, escalation clauses, performance-linked payments and risk-sharing arrangements to ensure that the government and defence forces receive value for money. Their understanding of legal frameworks like the Income-tax Act, GST laws and company law helps in aligning contractual terms with statutory requirements.

In recent years, technology and data analytics have emerged as powerful tools for improving public financial management. Chartered Accountants with exposure to IT and emerging technologies, such as those trained in Gen AI and advanced Excel, can design dashboards and analytical models to monitor defence expenditure in real time. By analysing large data sets similar to AIS/TIS information, they can flag unusual patterns, cost overruns or delays in projects at an early stage. This supports evidence-based decision-making and strengthens trust of citizens in how their taxes are being used.

Ultimately, the role of Chartered Accountants in defence and public finance goes beyond mere compliance. They act as ethical guardians of public money and strategic advisors to policymakers, defence leadership and industry participants. Even when the nation sleeps, CAs remain vigilant – ensuring financial systems behind the Indian Army, Navy and Air Force remain robust, accountable and future-ready. This contribution, though often invisible, is fundamental in building a financially strong and secure nation.
